- Attract new fencers to the sport
 - Partnership with the Urdd
 - April '22 10 x Urdd coaches were delivered "Core Coach"
 - 5 x sets of plastic swords provided across Wales
 - Delivering fencing to Welsh speaking primary schools
 - Communications to all clubs on their nearest Urdd Coach
 - Urge you to engage with them
 - 6 month review
 - Positive feedback from pupils, schools and Urdd coaches
 - Potential for further coach development

- Commonwealth Fencing Championships
 - Delivery of ADPC (Athlete Development Programme Cymru) programme in the lead up to the Commonwealths
 - All age groups together at one event
 - Logistical challenge staff/volunteers/accommodation etc
 - A huge thank you to all the coaches, TM's, athletes and supporters
 - Collated results
 - 1 x Gold
 - 2 x Age-group Gold
 - 4 x Silver
 - 7 x Bronze

2022 Priorities & Achievements (4)

- UKAD New Framework
 - British Fencing coordinating for all home nations
 - Lyn Robinson and Matt Russell identified as key points of contact
 - Close contact between WF and BF to ensure we comply with all requirements
 - Welsh Fencing framework approved with no amendments required
- Incorporating Welsh Veterans into WF
 - Agreed by the WVFA
 - Veterans will benefit from
 - Improved governance (financial & safeguarding)
 - Additional, coordinated support from the Board of WF



Governance

 WF continue to adhere to the governance requirements of Sport Wales to ensure our continued funding

- Policy review calendar implemented which has covered
 - Articles of Association
 - Development of a social media policy
 - Updated selection policy consultation from the membership



Finances

- Maintained financial support from Sport Wales throughout Covid period and 2022
- Recognised for 5 year planning process and surplus/deficit cycle
- Key Points
 - Covid related underspend for 2020-2021
 - Surplus will be neutralised in 2022 (4 x Commonwealth Events to support)
 - Investment in modernising and replacing equipment
 - Increasing expenditure for investment in attracting new members to the sport
 - Increasing expenditure for investment in developing new coaches
 - Increasing expenditure for investment in developing athletes for Commonwealths and beyond



Finances (cont)

• 2022/23 – Applying for increased funding to achieve our ambitions

- Successful in securing £18k capital investment from Sport Wales to enable our ambitions to better support para-fencing in Wales
 - Support the purchase of 2 x wheelchair frames & several ambidextrous wheelchairs suitable for fencing
 - We are planning coach development to support all clubs accept para-fencers

 - Commonwealth success
 - Return to a full fencing diary
 - Continued improvement of our policies
- 2023 will be as busy
